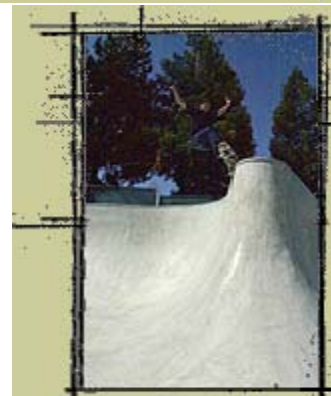


Phil Shao Memorial - Redwood City, CA

WHERE: Redwood City, CA (climate best by government test)

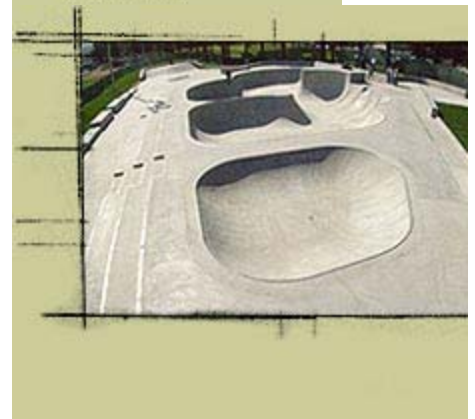

GOOD: The bowl is sick, be prepared to get served.

BAD: No lights yet, the stairs are kind of useless.

PADS: Helmet laws are posted but not enforced.

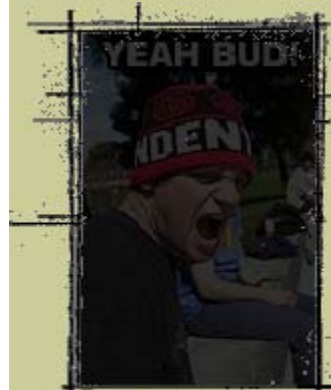
DIRECTIONS: Take 101 into Redwood City and take the Whipple Rd exit west to El Camino Real. Go South on El Camino till you hit Jefferson. Go right on Jefferson til you get to St. Francis St. and turn left. Go straight into the Red Morton Community Center parking lot and follow that all the way to the left. The skate park is on the right in the middle of the park.



OVERALL: It's a 8.5 out of 10 for California parks, probably a 7 overall.
